47 Meters Down is a cleverly contained thriller playing on the most common human fears. From a small budget of \$5M, it made a WW gross of \$62M. Similarly, Suspension taps into the claustrophobic terror of being inexorably trapped, then compounds it with humanity's most universal fear - heights.



Saw is a genre-changing franchise that immersed the audience in a horrific yet structured world.

Suspension leverages unique, contained spaces and intimate "what would I do?" scenarios to create high-tension thrills in a race against death. Taking it one step further, Suspension lives in a world where anyone behind a keyboard can be a villain.

Why this script?

Suspension capitalizes on the most primal human fears: heights.


A cinematic, pulse-pounding nightmare, this film is the event thrill-seeking Gen Z audiences have been waiting for. Suspension brings a world of opportunity to explore the IP in fresh ways including VR games, NFT characters, co-productions, and sequels.

We see a dizzying shot from outside the box, showing Penny suspended in a glass-bottomed enclosure, hovering 15 feet of from the edge or the rooftop. The cage sways gently in the high breeze. The elevator music stops and we hear a voice from the lo-fi PENNY
Yes! Yes, I want it to stop. Put me back on the roof! Now! MEMELORD69
Oh. No. I'm not going to do that. I don't want that, your social media manager doesn't want that, and I don't think that's what you really Sorry. Dumb joke. Anyway, Welcome to the bonus round. PENNY It is. It is. Please... Penny frantically looks around and sees a tiny camera at the top of the enclosure. She makes ardent eye contact with it. PENNY Why are you doing this? I just love fucking with people.
Well girls, really. I'm just trying Please. Put me back. MEMELORD69 to get a rise out of you. You've put your entire life online. Why not your death? Penny continues to try to calm down. Penny stares back to the camera. MEMELORD69 (CONT'D) I always wanted to know what would happen if I dropped a Penny from the top of this building. MEMELORD69 (CONT'D) Okay. All right. How can I say no to that face? Hold on tight. I'll The box jolts as it is lowered abruptly. Penny screams involuntarily. MEMELORD69 (CONT'D) All right. You're no fun. Well, we both need the content, right? MEMELORD69 (CONT'D)
Just kidding! Seriously though, I
can put you back. Later. First you
have to win the game. You're almost
there. Penny looks around, trying to see if there is some weakness in the box. MEMELORD69 (CONT'D) We're still live streaming now - on mute. You currently have over 800 thousand views - and climbing. The box is now level with the 2nd highest floor of the office building. Congratulations! That's a record MEMELORD69 (CONT'D)
Okay here's the deal. If you get up
to 2 million viewers, you can walk
away, free. Penny shakes with fear and rage.

Erick





Her work has been picked up for worldwide distribution after being showcased in over 75 horror film festivals with 47 award nominations and 20 wins. Feeding Time has 1.2M views on the Screamfest streaming platform.

My Left Arm, produced by Stacy, premiered at Dances with Films 2022 and was just nominated for Best Horror at Pasadena International Film Festival. Her thriller feature Abigail is currently in post-production, starring Karimah Westbrook (CW's All American) and Ava Cantrell (Warner Bros. Lights Out).

Pioneering high-quality film productions, Stacy expertly navigates the balance between creative and stakeholder needs. Stacy is a Chapman University alum with extensive experience in scaling multi-million dollar start-ups. Marrying her film know-how with her business, finance, and operations experience makes her an exceptionally adept producer.
